Whole School

Welcome back to Term 5 and the very changeable weather!

Uniform: A polite reminder about school uniform as some children are starting to come into school in a variety of clothing and this is not acceptable or fair on everyone else. We do have a uniform list and are very flexible but we do expect children to wear the school PE kit on the days when they have PE, which includes plain dark colour bottoms and a purple t shirt. On the other days, they should wear the agreed school uniform, including footwear, although some children are wearing trainers, which is acceptable but only if they are plain black. We have continued to be flexible on ties, but they are strongly encouraged for KS2, although not necessary if the weather is very hot!

Snacks: If the children have a snack for break times, these should be something healthy rather than sweets which a few children have started to bring in.



Food Share Project: Year 6 have been working on a food share project called 'Waste not want not...' You might have seen the new shed outside their classroom. We aim to open it on **Monday** and **Friday** after school - don't worry as Year 6 will leave from the corridor. The idea is for any of us to bring in food/toiletries on **Monday** or **Friday** morning which we won't be using at home before the best before date on the product. In doing this, we hope that someone else can make use of it rather than it being put into landfill. This can be fresh produce or tinned/boxed goods. There will be a drop off point by the school gates on **Monday** and **Friday**

morning and Year 6 will sort any donations before the end of the day. If anyone has any contacts with local food places/supermarkets who might also be able to donate to our waste not, want not project, please contact Mrs de Roeck.

Please try to ensure that your child is reading a minimum of 4 days a week and that they bring in their signed reading records on **Friday**. If they have a shorter stage book, they will need to read their book twice before changing it to ensure they have a good understanding of the text and the language used within it.

Please help your children access Spelling Shed as they should be playing **5 games** on it a week or writing their spellings out and bringing them in on **Friday**.

Any support you can give your children with their times tables would be beneficial.
