Reading Bookmarks

This all counts towards earning stickers for their reading bookmarks and a bronze, silver or gold certificate and then their very own book when they have filled four sides of a bookmark. Thank you.

Please help your children access Spelling Shed as they should be playing **5 games** on it a week or writing their spellings out and bringing them in on **Friday**.

Any support you can give your children with their times tables would be beneficial.
