
Book week 2024

World book day will be celebrated on Thursday 7 March. Our theme for this year is 'We are all unique - express yourself!' Each class will look at a different book which is based around identity, they will then present their work to the rest of the school on Wednesday 13 March.

For half term homework

• The children will bring home a challenge board to complete during half term. This will also be added to our E-bulletin.



- Your child will also bring home a luggage label to decorate with clues about their favourite book on one side. On the back, they can write the name of the book or draw it. They need to bring it into school on World Book Day so we can try to guess the book from their clues. These will then be hung on our tree in the entrance way for everyone to see.
- You could also spend this time thinking about what they might like to wear on Thursday 7 March (see below)

Book day activities

- Thursday 5 March 2024. Dress to express day: what makes you you? We would like the children to show us their identity. What do they like to wear? Why? Or it could be based around someone who inspire them. OR they might want to come dressed as a character who inspires them. We will be talking in classes about our reasons for choosing these outfits.
- Throughout the week, there will be **lunchtime story sessions** run by the Year 6 reading ambassadors. Your child will be able to pop along and listen to a story if they choose too.
- **Buddy reading.** During the week, we will be buddying up with different classes to read and enjoy stories together.
- There will also be chance to work out the identity of the readers who have been filmed reading a favourite story book.
- Our reading ambassadors will be holding another book swap the week after World Book Day. These will be held after school in the school hall.

Don't forget to bring a book to swap. There will also be a table for adult books so please come along!
