Billy Class

Billy Class have been talking about the creation story this week and finding out how we can look after our pets. This week has been busy, wet and seems to have flown by!

Phonics next week: air (as in chair), er (as in digger), double letters in words- **bb/rr/gg/dd/pp/ff/tt**.

Tricky words: are sure pure

We will begin our boat topic next week. The children will be testing out the most suitable materials for making boats, discovering waterproof materials and testing what will float or sink. We will design our boats next week and make them the following week.

In Maths we will move onto finding and representing 6, 7 and 8. How many can they see altogether? Where can you find 6/7/8?

In PE we will be learning about different kinds of jumps. The children will work together to make a simple sequence using different jumps. Remember PE day is Wednesday.

- al (l as in metal - always at the end of words)
- c (s as in ice)
- ve (v as in give - always at the end of words).

New Tricky words: school, call, different

Reviewing Tricky words: ask, Mr, Mrs, Ms

Reading books: Well done to Kiara and Eloise who are the first people to achieve their Bronze reading certificate! They have filled up one whole side of a bookmark.

To earn bookmark stickers, **remember to sign the reading record every day** that your child reads to you. This could also be a book from outside school. **1 day = 1 sticker.**

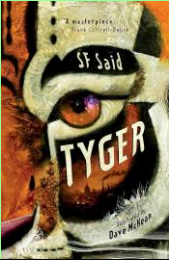
