



## Report on Goat Lees Primary School Sports Premium Expenditure for 2016/17

Summary of Pupils on roll and Sports Premium received

	2016/17
Sports Premium Grant	£8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil for the next two academic years. Total amount received: £8680

At Goat Lees Primary School the Governors and Headteacher believe the purpose of the Sports Premium should be;

- To establish PE and Sports as an integral part of the School curriculum at the school.
- To sustain and improve the provision of P.E. and School Sport throughout the whole school community.
- To ensure that teachers and support staff offer high quality Physical Education as part of the school curriculum and that continual professional development for existing staff is on-going.
- To provide appropriate competitive School Sport opportunities for all children who wish to take part.
- To identify, enthuse and engage with those children and families who are less active and, therefore, less likely to choose sport and exercise as a lifestyle choice.
- To work in partnership with other organisations and schools to maximise the potential of the P.E. and School sport funding and make best use of the facilities within the school grounds and within the local community.

### Provision and Principles

At Goat Lees Primary School we currently allocate funding in the following ways;

- Partial funding of a school minibus. This allows groups of children to access activities beyond the school grounds and increases the opportunities for wider sports participation and competitive sports.
- Funding is allocated after surveying pupils to ascertain the sporting provision they would like to see enhanced or included in the school and sports curriculum.
- Focussing on early intervention in promoting sports participation and a lifelong love of sport in the Early Years and Year 1.
- Ensuring that through Sports Premium funding Goat Lees Primary School is able to offer and sustain a wide variety of extra-curricular sports clubs made available to the whole school. This includes dance, multi skills, netball and athletics.
- Developing a wider range of sports through local competitions and tournaments.

- Staffing for accompanying children to sporting tournaments
- Additional hours for drivers for the minibus
- Partial funding for minibus
- Storage and PE equipment
- The servicing of bikes for children across the school to encourage cycling to school
- Developments in the Early Years provision (through the Early Excellence Project) to encourage active pupil participation and develop gross motor skills

## **Other sporting opportunities available to children in school 2016/17**

- Lunch time activities available to 100% of children from Years 1-6 throughout the year.
- Swimming extended to include Years 4 to 6
- Extension of activities available at the breakfast club to encourage greater activity as well as offering a balanced and varied breakfast
- Healthy schools initiatives
- Playleaders in upper school

## **Further Proposed activities for 2016/2017**

- Continued support for upskilling of new and existing teachers and for introducing new activities from Elite Coaching Company
- Lunchtime Activities
- Further support for the partial funding of the minibus to support transportation to swimming and sporting tournaments/activities
- School Games Day
- CPD
