
This week, if possible, we would like you to:

Phonics (Suggested focus and ideas)

This week we will be looking at different ways of spelling the graphemes $ext{def}$ and $ext{i}$.

What sounds do ear and i usually make?

Monday	Read and spell: Here mere severe adhere	Write: Here come all the people!			
Tuesday	Ear written as what Read and spell: Beer sheer veer	Match the eer words to the pictures below. If you don't know what a word means (e.g. sneer), ask your grown up or use a dictionary to find out the meaning). Write: Mr Harlow is steering the car!			
Wednesday	i written as # Read and spell: Gym crystal pyramid	Sort the words into a pile of 'ee' sounds (e.g. happy, baby) and 'l' sounds (e.g. gym, pyramid. You could create basketball game by writing the words on paper, then scrunching them up to throw them in the right pot/hoop. Write: There is a crystal in the pyramid. Ext: Change the position of the crystal e.g. under the pyramid, over, inside, between, underneath, inside.			
Thursday	Review or as	Au real/nonsense colouring Read: Find all the or/au/aw words in the postcard and colour them when you find them. What does that word say? Write: We saw that the dog had hurt its paw. Isn't that awful? Extension: you could explain that the word isn't is contracted from 'is not', so the apostrophe ' is added to show that the o has been removed. Encourage your child to add the apostrophe in the correct place.


